



In terms of your Course Outcomes, how many courses do you still need to revise? 26 responses




In terms of your Course Outcomes, how confident are you that your outcomes are appropriately written and formatted?








Were you able to complete your Curriculum Mapping? ²⁶ responses




Were you able to complete your Communications Plan? ²⁶ responses
