

Healthcare College Express

This program is designed for students interested in a healthcare profession. The Healthcare College Express courses are offered during afternoon College Express. Students will learn Healthcare Law, Medical Ethics, Pathophysiology and Pharmacology*, Medical Record Documentation Requirements, Medical Coding, and Healthcare Regulations that govern all healthcare settings (hospital, nursing home, home health, veterinarian medicine etc.). The program is designed to offer a wide variety of learning experiences, including classroom lectures, hands on coding and health information management for both hospital and ambulatory healthcare settings. Healthcare professionals in the field use electronic health records to document notes, enter diagnoses and procedure codes, and must abide by healthcare law and regulations. Each of these courses provide valuable knowledge for pursuing any health related profession.
