Nursing Program Admissions Test (ATI-TEAS®) Fact Sheet for Students

The ATI TEAS® is an assessment used to effectively identify applicants with the foundational knowledge required for successful entry into nursing programs. Research has shown students with a higher preparedness category (Proficient, Advanced, and Exemplary) perform better academically in their first semester of nursing courses. For this reason, all students applying to the nursing program must pass the ATI TEAS® with a Proficient or higher.

Five Steps to ATI TEAS Success

I. Know when and where to register.

a. Create an Account with ATI prior to your test date

1. Go to www.atitesting.com (Firefox is the recommended browser to use).
2. In the Secure Sign On area click on “Create an account”.
3. When a new screen opens, fill in all your blue fields. Blue fields are required to create your account. In the “Institution” field select “Danville Area CC ADN”. Please also enter your DACC student ID number. You must do this before you can test.
4. Write down your User Name and Password and SAVE in a safe place. You will not be able to take the ATI TEAS® test without them and you will use them throughout the nursing program.
5. Click the “Register” button; wait for the progress bar to complete. You are DONE creating your ATI account!
6. STOP!! Do not go any further.

b. Secure a Credit card or Debit card prior to your test date

1. On the day you test, you must have either a credit card or debit card to pay for the TEAS. Cash or checks will not be accepted.

3. Cost of the Test and to re-test is \$ 55.00

What is the question format?

- The questions are all multiple choice.

How many times can I attempt the ATI TEAS®?

- Student may have 2 attempts per application period with a 30 day waiting period between attempts.

When can I re-test?

- You may re-test after a 30 day waiting period and when there is a seat available on a scheduled testing date. Cost to re-test is \$55.00

Can I use a calculator for the math portion?

- Yes, they are embedded in the online version of the exam.

When will I get my tests results?

- Right after the test is completed.

Will DACC accept ATI TEAS® scores taken at another location?

- Yes, if you received a Proficient or better and it is current within the past two years.

How long is the ATI TEAS® test score good for?

- It is good for two years.
