Notes:

1. The Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice meets the objectives of students interested in careers in law enforcement, the courts, corrections, juvenile justice, private security, as well as students preparing for graduate work in criminal justice or criminology.
2. A minor in some other field of study is required for Criminology and Criminal Justice majors. Electives should be used towards this requirement. Eighteen hours are needed for the minor.
3. One year of college foreign language is required regardless of high school foreign language completed. Spanish is recommended.
4. Must complete an interdisciplinary requirement. Choose from BIOL 105 or SOCY 200. If not taken at DACC, student may have to take at SIU.
5. Must complete two (2) Humanities and one (1) Fine Arts in order to satisfy SIU's core curriculum.
