1. 2.0 GPA (4.0 scale).

### **ADMISSION TO THE TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM:**

*(Admission to the College of Education does not guarantee admission to the teacher education program.)*

Students are eligible to make formal application to the program with:

1. An overall GPA of at least 2.75 (4.0 scale).
2. Completion of ENGL 101 and ENGL 102 with a grade of C or better.

### **To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:**

1. As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure. This includes the SAT and ACT exams. Students will still need to pass the edTPA and content tests in the relevant subject and grade they intend to teach.

### **Notes:**

1. Although a minor field is not required, English majors are encouraged to consider complementary minor fields such as foreign languages and literatures, history, philosophy, linguistics, speech communication, journalism, psychology, sociology, political science, African studies, Black American studies, theater, computer science, business administration or marketing.
2. All English Teacher Education majors are required to have two years of a single foreign language in high school or two semesters in college.
3. BIOL 100, 101, 102, or 104 recommended.
4. CHEM 100, CHEM 101, CHEM 102, and CHEM 133, and PHYS 107 or PHYS 143 will meet this requirement.
5. All teacher certification majors are required to take a three-hour course in Third World or Non-Western Culture, either in Humanities or Social Science.
6. MUSI 115, ARTS 115, ARTS 105, and LITR 105 or HUMN 101 recommended.
7. LITR 114, LITR 122, PHIL 101, PHIL 102, PHIL 103, ARTS 111, ARTS 112 are recommended.
