## **Transfer Admission Requirements:**

1. 2.0 GPA (4.0 scale). Students will need a higher GPA to get accepted for any Science or Pre-Med major.

## **Notes:**

1. Supportive Skills Requirement Elective: Students in the College of Science must take two classes (six hours) to complete the Supportive Skills requirement. Students earning their BA in Zoology can choose from option (a) or option (b). Students earning their BS should choose option (b):
  - a. Foreign Language – two college semesters of Spanish.
  - b. MATH115 Survey of Statistics, MATH 161 Statistics, and CBUS 150 Business Computer Systems.
2. The Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Zoology at SIUC is offered with the following specializations:
  - Animal Biology
  - Environmental Biology
  - Fisheries Biology and Aquatic Conservation
  - Pre-Veterinary Science
  - Wildlife Biology and Conservation

The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Zoology is for students who plan on non-science careers but desire a strong background in zoology. The major includes 20-25 hours of free electives which can be used for a minor or second major.
