## **Transfer Admission Requirements:**

- 1. 2.7 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).
- 2. Sixty (60) semester hours of credit.
- 3. UIUC has seven (7) different Political Science concentrations: General, Citizen Politics, Civic Leadership, International Relations, Law and Power, World Politics, and Public Policy.

## **NOTES:**

- 1. The Foreign Language requirement may be met by completing four years of a single foreign language in high school or four levels of collegiate work. Students are **strongly** encouraged to fulfill the requirement prior to transfer.
- 2. State-wide general education core only recognizes the 4th semester of foreign language as humanities credit. Therefore, students who completed 4 years of foreign language in high school should select a humanities elective in this slot.
- 3. Students needing to take a foreign language while at DACC should enroll in a third humanities/fine arts course. However, students having the foreign language requirements met should enroll in any transferrable elective for this slot.
