Transfer Admission Requirements:

- 1. 2.0 Grade Point Average (4.0 scale).
- 2. Admission to the College of Education does not guarantee admission to the teacher education program. Admission is granted only after specific criteria have been met.
- 3. It is recommended to transfer after 2-3 semesters even without a degree at DACC. DACC does not offer as many of the required courses.

Admission to the Teacher Education Program:

- 1. An overall grade point average of at least 2.75 (4.0 Scale).
- 2. Completion of ENGL101 and ENGL102 with a grade of C or better.
- 3. Two letters of recommendation from college or university faculty. Transfer students may bring letters of recommendation from school(s) previously attended.

To become a licensed/certified teacher in the State of Illinois, an individual must pass at least three state exams:

- As of June 30, 2019, the Test of Basic Skills is no longer required to obtain an educator licensure. This includes the SAT and ACT exams. Students will still need to pass the edTPA and content tests in the relevant subject and grade they intend to teach.
